

When the first outbreak of COVID happened, did you feel that your school administrators adapted swiftly and efficiently to outline new plans and guidelines for teachers?

- 67% - All things considered, I think they adapted pretty well
- 20% - Yes, I was very impressed
- 12% - Not at all, it was a disaster

What was the biggest challenge of distance learning for you?

- 52% - Keeping my students motivated to continue engaging with the curriculum since grading transitioned to pass/fail
- 16% - Adapting to using new tech platforms and having to teach virtually
- 15% - All things considered, everything went relatively well, I just missed the students!
- 10% - Not having much direction from school administrators made me feel like I had to figure out how to adapt on my own
- 5% - Many of my students didn't have access to laptops/tablets or wi-fi, so they weren't even able to log in

Are you hoping that your school opens up for in-person instruction at the beginning of the fall semester?

- 39% - Not completely sure
- 35% - Yes, definitely
- 25% - No, we should start remote

What do you think is the best approach for the 2020-21 school year?

- 48% - Implement a hybrid approach with mixed in-classroom teaching as well as remote learning from home
- 26% - Start the school year off in person and shut down later on in the year if needed
- 21% - Plan to continue distance learning for the remainder of 2020 with plans to return to in-person instruction at the start of 2021
- 4% - None of the above

What are you most concerned about **as an educator** when/if schools do open for in-person instruction?

- 47% - Personally being exposed to the virus and/or exposing my students
- 16% - Ensuring my classroom meets the CDC's social distancing recommendations
- 13% Dealing with unrealistic expectations from administrators to get students back on track
- 11% - I'm not concerned because my school has already prepared for all of the above
- 6% - Budget cuts putting a strain on my capabilities in the classroom
- 5% - Not getting the professional development needed to teach online if we have to transition back to remote learning

What are you most concerned about **for your students** when/if schools open for in-person instruction?

- 38% - Their exposure to the virus (student/families physical health)
- 33% - Social-emotional health or behavioral issues
- 23% - Feeling academically overwhelmed and falling behind
- 4% - I'm not concerned because my school has already prepared for all of the above
